- **The required lessons and responses are always going to be highlighted.** These will be the “meat” of the weekly learning plan. The rest of the activities are suggestions. We do hope you are able to get to some of them, as we picked them especially for our students.
- As far as the days of the week go, **you do not need to use the schedule as written.** Meaning do the activities as you can with your family's schedule.
- **Much of the work builds upon the day before.** Therefore, it would be important for you to look at the activities/lessons before and after the one you are choosing to make sure there is nothing they need to know or do prior to the activity you want to do. Writing, for example, usually starts the assignment at the beginning of the week and adds to it each day.
- Let me know if you have any issues, I am here to help. Some of you are very good about that and it is greatly appreciated.
- Please keep in mind that I would also LOVE to hear about your successes and any activities your child was particularly fond of. This helps me to know where to go from here. Plus I really miss the students and I would love to see what they are working on at home!
- Please have fun with your child. As much as this situation is not ideal, it does give you one thing you may not have again - the privilege of watching your child work and progress on a daily basis so you can cherish those “ah-ha! moments”..
