Key Words	Meaning
LMS	An LMS is a Learning Management System.
	Each LMS is a tool to help people (teachers, students, parents, etc.) to organize and manage school work and communications.
	Examples: Blackboard, Schoology, Canvas, Microsoft Teams, Seesaw, Google Classroom are all Learning Management Systems.
Login	To login is to get into a computer, program, or website. When you login, you might need a password.
	Example: You login to your email with your username and password.
Navigation	Navigation is the process to get around a computer program.
	Navigation includes clicking the right buttons to get where you want to go and do what you want to do.
Dashboard	A dashboard is the first place you get to in an LMS.
Dashboaru	The dashboard shows key information and gives a current summary about a student's progress in a course.
	Example: After logging in, the dashboard shows you that the teacher has posted an announcement and that there is a new assignment for you due next week.
Assignment	An assignment is something that the student is to do as part of the work in a class.
	Example: "Your assignment is to write three sentences to describe what you think would make for a good story."
Download	To download is to get a file from the internet onto your device (computer, tablet, etc.)
	Example: "Click on this link to download the assignment directions."
Upload	To upload is to put a file from your device (computer, tablet, etc.) onto the internet. Example: " Upload a picture of your drawing."



Attachment	An attachment is a file (image, document, etc.) that can be connected to an
Attachment	assignment, email, or message.
	Example: "Be sure to add your picture as an attachment to the assignment."
Submit	To submit something means that you are turning that something into the teacher.
	Example: "Be sure to click the submit button after you have attached all your work."
Link/URL	A link is an object that allows you to go to a specific webpage or file. On the internet, the specific address is called a URL (Uniform Resource Locator).
	Example: <u>Click on this link</u> to learn more about Washington's resources for parents and families.
Content Library	A content collection is the group of all files, documents, resources, etc. that a teacher has for the course.
	Example: "You can find the vocabulary list and a digital copy of our book in the content collection ."
Discussion Forum/Thread	A discussion forum is a place where students can virtually chat with each other and the teacher about topics. A discussion thread is a conversation around one topic or idea.
	Example: "Find a topic in the discussion forum that interests you and post some of your thoughts in at least one thread ."
Asynchronous	Asynchronous means something is happening at different times.
	Example: Watching a pre-recorded video on your own time is asynchronous learning.
Synchronous	Synchronous means something is happening at the same time.
	Example: Engaging on a live Zoom call is synchronous learning.
