


- Canvas is the virtual classroom platform for all grades K-12 within Everett Public Schools



- Q: Will there be paper resources or will everything be online?
- A: We expect nearly everything to be provided through the virtual classroom on Canvas. If teachers provide paper assignments as well, they will communicate this to families. For additional resources please see the online student tools: <u>https://www.everettsd.org/domain/2152</u>
- Q: What kind of supplies will our student need? What are we providing and what is the school providing? For example, will headphones be provided?
- A: The usual classroom supplies, but you will need them available at home. Please see school website. The school is unable to provide headphones with a microphone for each student. The chromebooks that are provided do have built in microphones.

- Q: Do parents need to remain next to their student the whole time they are "in class"?
- A: No, teachers will guide the learning during synchronous learning times. Please support your child as needed with using the technology to access learning sessions and assignments.



- Q: What about students who are attending daycare and participating in Zoom from there?
- A: We have plans to reach out to community daycare centers in our area to share distance learning schedules and expectations. We will not share information on or discuss individual students.
- Q: How many websites will I need to be aware of for my student? I don't want to miss anything.
- A: Canvas will be the virtual classroom. Think of it as the starting point with links to other websites.
