2021 Prodigies for Peace Writing Contest Grades 6-8 and Grades 9-12

Please write an essay on the following question:

Rev. Dr. Martin King Jr. wrote "An individual has not started living until he can rise above the narrow confines of his individualistic concerns to the broader concerns of all humanity."

As a nation today we are as divided as when Dr. King gave his "I Have a Dream Speech," how would you encourage others to replace their individual concerns with the broader concerns of humanity?

Background and Instructions:

Consider how Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.'s legacy affected the civil rights and other important issues of all Americans. In 1963 during the March on Washington, Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. spoke of his dreams that "one day this nation will rise up and live out the true meaning of its creed: 'We hold these truths to be self-evident: that all men are created equal.'" His message was to reach all people to overcome the fear and hate that creates inequality and injustice – what is your message?

Grades 6-8: minimum: 250 words maximum: 750 words Grades 9-12: minimum: 500 words maximum: 1,000 words

Note: Although the question is the same for both grade groups, there will be separate contest winners for Grade 6-8 and for Grade 9-12.
