Dear Incoming Freshmen, New and Returning T-Wolf Students, and Parents:

As this record-breaking summer weather continues to shine on, we are excitedly preparing for another great year at Jackson High School! Pictures

Students **must** have their picture taken (even if they are not paying for photos or an ASB card), as all students are required to carry a school photo ID card while at school. The JHS photo ID card is **free** of charge. For students who are purchasing pictures, *a separate check is needed for each student payable to "Dorian," the photography company.* Please see enclosed order form for more information, payment details, and options. Picture retakes will be taking place during the school day on Friday, October 7.

ASB Card & Yearbook Sales

Associated Student Body (ASB) cards and yearbooks are available to all students for purchase online. **ALL students turning out for sports and clubs/activities are required to have an ASB card.** The proceeds from ASB cards help pay for athletics, dances, assemblies, and other student activities. Student Parking Priority System

Please note that parking spot numbers will not be assigned in 2022-23. Students will be assigned to a lot (lower or upper), but not to a specific numbered spot within that lot.

Students are to apply for a parking permit by filling out the E-Form. Once approved, students will receive a message to bring in the necessary documentation and to pay. To access the E-Form click [HERE](#) or use the QR code (below). Seniors and juniors who have applied by 7:30 a.m. on Friday, August 26, will be e-mailed by Wednesday, August 31, with next steps.

Parking will be assigned using the following priority order: main lot first, then upper lot.

1. Highest priority: Zero-period seniors
2. Second priority: Zero-period juniors
3. Third priority: *Full-time seniors
4. Fourth priority: *Full-time juniors
5. Fifth priority: Part-time seniors
6. Lowest priority: Part-time juniors



E-Form link will be live starting Monday, August 15, at 7:30 a.m. and will close Friday, August 26, at 7:25 a.m.

Complete Annual Updates Online

At the beginning of each school year there will be a window of time when families are asked to complete an annual update to their children's information. The window will typically be in the first two months of school. Each family will receive an e-mail letting them know that the Annual Update window has launched and asking one guardian to complete the annual update of information for each of their children. The information requested varies depending on each child's grade level but will typically include:

- Contact information for student, guardians, and emergency contacts
- Priority order of contacts
- Health and transportation updates
- Verification documentation for address change, custody agreements, document updates, etc.

While each household has a guardian who receives the email, qualifying guardians can log in to the Home Access Center ([HAC](#)) to complete the updates. The update for each student can only be submitted by one guardian for that student.

Fall Sports

We are very excited to announce that the Everett Public Schools athletic department has partnered with FinalForms, an online forms and data management service. FinalForms allows you to complete and sign athletic participation forms for your student(s) for fall, winter, and spring sports—NOW! This means FinalForms saves data from season to season and year to year—you will never need to enter the same information twice! FinalForms also pre-populates information wherever possible for each of your students, saving you time.

You may review your data at any time to verify that it is current. You will be required to sign your forms once per year and after any update. Click on the [Parent Playbook](#) to get started in FinalForms. If you require any support during the process in FinalForms, click [Get Help](#). We are asking ALL parents of athletes to use FinalForms.



High school football starts August 17. All other high school fall sports begin August 22. Middle school sports (football, softball, XC) start September 12. You will need a current physical on file, which you can upload directly to FinalForms.

Lockers

School lockers are available and will be assigned to interested students. Lockers will be assigned by 3rd period instructors during the 2nd week of school.

Each student will be provided with a 1:1 district-issued device. Students should have laptops ready and charged. Instructors will provide information in the course syllabus that will highlight additional supplies that are needed. Students are encouraged to have the following basic school supplies:

School Meals

As you plan for school meals in 2022-23, it is important to know a huge change in school meal funding. The USDA does not have authority to extend the “free meals for all” program past the end of the 2021-22 school year. School meals at JHS will be as it was in the past, where you can apply for free or reduced meals (FRM) or purchase your meals. The one change for FRM is that all those who qualify for free and reduced meals will get them free. There will be no “reduced.” There are additional benefits to qualifying as well, including reduction in ASB fees, scholarship opportunities, and more. 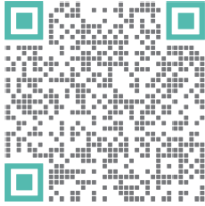

Wear simple clothing. Solid shirts or small patterns, along with sleeves, photograph best. A simple collared shirt is a timeless classic.



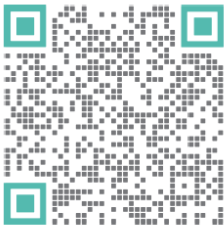
Avoid logos and text on clothing. Graphics or wording may not photograph completely and can become partially cropped out of your picture.

Dear Parent or Guardian:

As a parent, there is nothing more important than safeguarding your child's health. The Washington State Legislature requires us to make information available to you about meningococcal disease and human papillomavirus (HPV). Know the facts about these diseases and the vaccines available to protect your child.

Meningococcal Disease and Prevention

What is meningococcal disease?

Meningococcal disease is a serious bacterial infection. Fortunately, this life-threatening illness is rare, with only 20-30 cases reported each year in Washington. The most common symptoms of the disease include fever, cough, headache, and rash. It can cause meningitis (swelling of the covering of the brain and spinal cord). The disease spreads through close contact with an infected person. Teens and young adults are more likely to get meningococcal disease, especially if they live in group settings like college dorms.

How can I protect my child from meningococcal disease?

The meningococcal conjugate vaccine, or MCV4, prevents against four types of the disease. It is recommended for all children between 11 and 12 years of age, and again at 16 to 18 years of age. The meningococcal B vaccine, or MenB, is recommended for some children with rare health conditions or who are at risk during a meningococcal B outbreak.

Human Papillomavirus (HPV) and Prevention

What is HPV?

HPV is a common virus. Most people exposed to HPV will never develop health issues. But for others, HPV causes major health problems, including cervical, anal, vulvar, mouth, and throat cancer. Most infected people have no symptoms and may spread the virus without knowing it. HPV spreads mainly through sexual contact.

How can I protect my child from HPV?

Make sure your child gets the HPV vaccine. The vaccine is highly effective. The HPV vaccine can prevent infection from some of the most common and serious types of HPV that cause cancer and genital warts. The vaccine does not get rid of existing HPV infections.

Who should get the vaccine and when should they get it?

Because the vaccine is more effective when given at younger ages, two doses of HPV vaccine are recommended for all boys and girls starting at ages 9 to 14. If boys or girls do not get the first dose of HPV vaccine before age 15, it is recommended as a three-dose series.

Where can I find the meningococcal and HPV vaccines?

Talk to your healthcare provider about the vaccines your child needs. In addition to meningococcal and HPV, your preteen should receive Tdap. Washington offers vaccines at no cost to kids through age 18. Providers may charge an office visit fee or administration fee to give the vaccine. If you can't afford these fees, you can ask to have them waived.

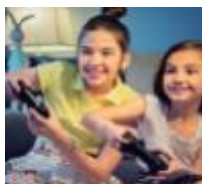
JHS PTSA offers & supports the following REFLECTIONS

WSPTA ESSAY CONTEST



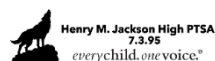
