### Classroom & Student Expectations

Seventh grade students are unique academically and socially. Each student will bring special attributes to the classroom that will be accepted and honored. Working together with different abilities, attitudes, and expectations takes patience and perseverance. It also requires that each student be a responsible citizen in our class.

Each and every day, students are to follow these expectations to ensure that our class runs in a safe and productive manner.

### **Classwork & Homework Expectations**

All classwork and homework is required in order to be successful in this class. Assessments will make up 70% of your grade, while classwork and homework will make up the remaining 30%. All work must not only be completed, but must meet standards/expectations and given requirements to be accepted.

In this class we have three regular homework assignments. Please note that during some units and projects there will be other ADDITIONAL homework assigned. Homework is posted on my front whiteboard each morning. Students are given time in class to write the homework into their agenda. **Please check student agendas for information regarding homework and classroom activities**.

# Homework Assignment Descriptions:

# Writer's Notebook (WrNB): Monday-Thursday nights

Writer's notebooks are used to increase fluency of writing, practice various forms of writing, and to practice various concepts and skills related to writing.

Students must follow the prompt and directions completely (ex: 7-8 sentences per paragraph, # of paragraphs, format, genre, etc.)

- Monday Students choose their own topic and form of writing
- Tuesday through Thursday Teacher generates topic and form of writing

# Accelerated Reader (AR) & Reading Bookmarks: Nightly

AR is used to increase independent reading for students. This year every 7<sup>th</sup> grader will have an AR goal of at least 60 points per semester. If your child receives reading support in a resource class or Read 180, those points will also count towards his/her AR goal. Our major objective is to get every student to read and finish books regularly. Each trimester, AR points will count as a 100 point assessment in reading. To meet your AR goal you need to:

- Read at least 30 minutes outside of class daily
- Record reading times and pages read on your bookmark

### Vocabulary Development: Nightly

Students will learn new vocabulary words daily. Our Visual Vocabulary program is based on a mnemonic system designed for learning new words that are aligned with the SAT. Students should study their words in preparation for biweekly exams.

**Study Clubs/After School Help:** Students will be able to use my room on Thursday, from 2:00 p.m. - 3:00 p.m., to complete homework or receive additional help on block work. If your student falls behind, I will assign Study Club. Students can make appointments with me if I have notice and am available.
