iReady diagnostic tests in Math and Reading for our $1^{st} - 5^{th}$ graders are finishing up in early October. We will be using this data to help determine the growth areas specific for each student.

We have our Showcase of Learning this month as well! This is an opportunity to learn about your student's classroom, teacher and what they will be learning this year. We will have a live zoom and then recorded sessions from each teacher. These will all be posted and available on our website through the month of October.

SBA

Our 4th and 5th graders will be taking their 2021 SBA tests in October. We are excited for our students to have this opportunity to show what they know and for us to have data that will guide their learning paths and identify their needs. They will be taking the previous grade level assessment, 4th grade taking 3rd grade assessments and 5th grade taking 4th grade assessments.

Title I

Garfield Elementary participates in the Title I Program. As a Title I school, we qualify for federal grant money which we use for additional staffing, parent involvement, staff development, and extended school day opportunities to help us meet our goals.

At Garfield we are fortunate to have a math and reading coach as well as several paraeducators to support our students. These individuals work with students in small groups and individually in the classrooms to provide the support needed to strengthen their academic skills. We have a family support specialist that can connect our families with resources in the community. Your partnership is vital to our success and we look forward to working with you to determine the best ways to support our children!

Homeless resources

We care about all our Everett Public Schools families and know many are experiencing economic impacts due to changes in the economy. If not your family directly, you may know others who are starting to question whether there is any help available. If you are staying temporarily with someone else because you lost your housing, or are staying in a motel, campground, shelter, outside or are in an inadequate place, you and your children have special rights at school. Everett Public Schools' Kids in Transition (KIT) program supports students who qualify as homeless under the federal <u>McKinney-Vento Homeless Act</u>. Students without a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence may qualify. The KIT program works to eliminate barriers to students' academic success. If you believe your child qualifies, please complete the <u>online Housing Questionnaire</u>. For more information, visit the <u>KIT website</u> or contact the KIT office at 425-385-4032.



Rights include:

- Keeping your children in the same school even if you move, and receiving transportation to that school, as long as it is in the student's best interest;
- Enrolling in school immediately without the documents schools usually require;
- Receiving free school meals;
- Getting help with school supplies and other needs;
- Receiving extra support for youth who are on their own;
- Connecting young children with early childhood services;
- and referrals to other community resources.

Get resources and activities for your children from <u>Sesame Street in Communities</u>, including tips for <u>how to talk to your child</u> <u>about homelessness</u> and <u>how to create a feeling of home</u> even if you are moving around a lot.
