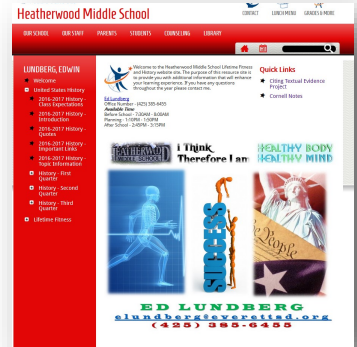

1. Request your password be reset through LMS (please provide the student name, birthdate and grade)
2. Log in using temporary password - [link here](#)
3. This is a temporary password, may say your password has expired - click on "CLICK HERE to change your password"
4. Create new password
5. Log back in to the same RapidIdentity system to set up challenge questions
6. Setting up challenge questions will help you in the future change your password or retrieve a forgotten password

Class Text Book

The first thing you will need to get is a textbook. You will be assigned a book that will be tuned in at the end of the school year. Like all other classes you will be responsible for any damage. You can also access an online version of the text book through the LMS grade site. Click on the Pearson link in the lower right hand corner.

Homework

The homework policy in this class is flexible *but not optional!* Students are expected to study the material and class discussions in a way that fits their learning style. Homework will be monitored online but will not be collected or graded. This is not to say that students do not have any homework! Students are expected to come to class prepared with an understanding of the material. A majority of assignments for this class can be completed online. Students can access the class website which will direct them to the correct assignments. If students do not have access to a computer or Internet they do have the option of completing their work before or after school in the Heatherwood or public library. Students can also copy off the assignments and work on a hard copy.

You are assigned to read a certain amount of pages each week. The assigned readings can be found on the website

Study Groups

In this class there are four study groups to help to meet the different levels of academic ability. These groups are the Study Session Group, the Essential Question Group, the Research and Review Group and the Research Group. To help get you use to the class routine, you will start in the Essential Question Group.

Essential Question Group

The purpose of this group is to provide a weekly guided reflection questions on Tuesday and Thursday that will help students to understand the main emphasis of the class readings. The links to these online assignments can be found online. It is important that students take their time when responding and provide thorough and complete answers. Students who complete these assignments will take an exam that includes true/false, matching, fill-in and two essay questions.

Study Packet

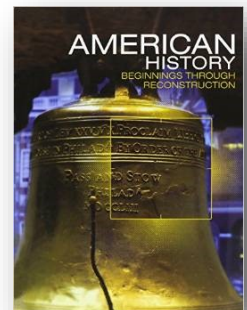
