

# Earn world language credit

Can you fluently read, write, speak, and listen in a language other than English?

Students in grades **9 through 12** can earn high school world language credit by demonstrating their level of proficiency in listening, speaking, reading, and writing on a qualifying world language assessment.

- Earn up to four proficiency-based high school credits
- Credits count towards the world language credit graduation requirement
- Students who demonstrate the highest level of proficiency (and demonstrate proficiency in English language course work and assessments) earn the Seal of Biliteracy on their diploma.



## Registration open now through November 6 for online testing by appointment this fall

### Registration:

Students must register at <https://bit.ly/3hQpID6> and will be billed the \$10 testing fee after approval.

Testing will be online and scheduled to minimize impact to each student's schedule. Students will need photo ID and a smart phone or other device with a camera, in addition to their district issued computer.

Not every language assessment is available in an online format, some students may need to test when we return to in-person instruction.
