National Merit Scholarship Program

Students who take the PSAT/NMSQT® as juniors are automatically entered into the <u>National Merit Scholarship Program</u>. Scholarships available through the National Merit Scholarship Program not only help students and families pay for college and training, but they also distinguish students in the post-high school education admission process.



Mark Your Calendar

The PSAT/NMSQT® is administered at your child's school in October of their junior year to qualify for the National Merit Scholarship Program.

Program Recognition

In September of your child's senior year, students with high scores on the PSAT/NMSQT® from their junior year are notified through their schools that they have qualified as either Commended Students or Semifinalists.

Commended Students: More than two-thirds of the high scorers on the PSAT/NMSQT® receive Letters of Commendation in recognition of their outstanding academic promise. Although Commended Students do not continue in the competition for National Merit Scholarships, some of these students do become candidates for special scholarships sponsored by corporations and businesses.

Semifinalists: Approximately one-third of the high scorers are notified that they have qualified as Semifinalists. To be considered for a National Merit Scholarship, Semifinalists must submit a National Merit Scholarship Application and take the SAT. Finalists: In February of senior year, selected Semifinalists are notified that they have advanced to Finalist standing. Principals are also notified and provided with a Certificate of Merit to present to each Finalist.

Winner Selection: On a rolling basis, beginning in March and ending in June of senior year, scholars are notified if they have been offered an award.

Students who prepare using Official SAT Practice see substantial improvement in their PSAT/NMSQT® and SAT scores.
