## From the Principal

Eisenhower Families,

We are so excited to welcome back many of our students to our hybrid model beginning on Monday, April 19 with one group of students, and on Thursday, April 22 with a different set of students. As we move into this model there will be a transition period as teachers navigate how to effectively teach students in the room and on zoom concurrently.

The first week will provide challenges as we are training in person students on systems and protocols in the building while trying to provide meaningful activities for students who are remote. Specifically, at the sixth-grade level students will be provided with a tour of the building to become familiar with the school. Students who are remote will have alternate activities as we orient students who have not attended our building before. We ask for patience as we navigate this.

We wanted to provide information to students and families who will be returning next week so please take the time to review this newsletter with your student so they will have some idea of what the first few days will look like.

I want to emphasize that if your student is slated to be on site but has any indication they are not feeling well, please keep them home as they can still access class online. Unlike the traditional school year, there should not be a sense they will fall behind.



**Arrival**

When students arrive, we will check to ensure that they have their attestation form on file. If they do not, they will not be admitted into the building.

Students who arrive via a bus will enter on the North side of the building near the bus loop. Students who walk or are being dropped off in a vehicle will enter the building on the West side of the building near the main office. Please refer to the visual below:



Upon admittance students will be lined up, socially distanced, by their first period teacher, in different areas based on grade level. Teachers will then escort their students to class. Students will receive a class schedule and map in first period on the first day. We will follow this method each morning for the first week.



### Supplies

Each day students who are on campus should have traditional school supplies such as **paper, writing utensils** and any **class specific supplies** such as books necessary for class (math workbook, novel, etc). Students will not be allowed to share supplies.

In addition, it is important that students bring their **Chromebook fully charged** each day as access to charging will be very limited based on the need to maintain social distancing. We also ask that students bring **earbuds, a refillable water bottle** (drinking fountains will not be available) and a **mask**. Students must wear their mask appropriately at all times or risk being moved back to remote only.

### Schedule:

## Breakfast and Lunch

Breakfast and lunch are free to all students for the remainder of the year. Students will have three lunch choices each day. Students may also pick up a breakfast for the following morning at lunch time to take home and eat at home. We will not be providing breakfast in the morning due to social distancing constraints. Students should pick up their breakfast at lunch the day prior and take it home.

The lunchroom is set up so students are 6 feet apart and we also have additional seating outside for students who choose to eat their lunch outside.

## Safety

We are limiting entrance to the building to students and staff only. Parents and other visitors will not be permitted to enter the building, but will be met at the door for needs such as signatures, lunch or medication drop off and any other situations that arise.

There are markings on the floor throughout the building indicating that students should walk on the right side of the hallway and remain 6 feet apart.



Student desks are spaced 6 feet or more apart and desks will be sanitized before each period. Each class has hand sanitizer available as well.

## Departure

Students who ride the bus will go to the bus loop (North side of the building) and line up according to bus number. Students need to keep their face mask on and socially distance. When their bus arrives, the students will be escorted to their bus.

Students who are being picked up will go to the front of the building (East side) and wait for their ride. Students need to keep their face mask on and socially distance.

Students who walk or ride a bike must keep their mask on and socially distance until off school grounds. Students are expected to leave campus immediately after school.
