At EPS, Kindergarten begins with **Everett Ready** a transition-into-kindergarten program

- Monday, August 19 to Thursday, August 22 (current dates*)
- Half-day: 3 hours / day 9:10-12:10
- Transportation provided for qualified students
 (If student is enrolled and registered for Everett Ready by July 31)
- Family meeting on August 19th 9:15 (tentative date)

WaKIDS - Washington Kindergarten Inventory of Developing Skills



Family Connection Meeting

- Welcomes you into the Washington K-12 system as partners in your child's education through a family conference with your child's teacher.
- The meetings take place during the first 3 school days (dates to be released in August) when grades 1-12 students are starting school.
- This is an opportunity for you to get to know your child's teacher, share information about your child, and ask questions.

Whole-Child Assessment

Helps kindergarten teachers learn about the skills and strengths of the children in their classrooms so they can meet the needs of each child.

Early Learning Collaboration

Aligns practices of early learning professionals and kindergarten teachers to support smooth transitions for children.

- o Contributes to the development of self-regulation & social skills
- Promotes physical well-being & coordination
- Encourages reading & writing
- Enhances communication & collaboration
- Develops character & citizenship

21st Century Skills



Second Step™ – Social Emotional Learning



The Second Step™ curriculum promotes self-regulation: the ability to monitor and manage emotions, thoughts, and behaviors.

Helps children focus their attention on learning when they might be distracted by others, upset by a problem, or excited about an upcoming event. Increases the ability to self-regulate and helps children get along better, engage with teachers and their peers, and promoting positive social goals and values.

It's a key to school readiness that supports children's ability be successful in both academic and social situations.

Multilingual Learner (ML) Program



Multilingual

Learners

 The program provides structured language acquisition instructions to students whose native language is not English and qualified Native American students

 Students are assessed measuring their speaking, listening, reading, and writing skills. Scores indicate if support is required

ML services are available at all our schools

Current Students (Preschool / Transitional Kindergarten)



If you have a student currently attending an EPS early learning program: ECEAP Preschool, Developmental Preschool (DPK), or Transitional Kindergarten (TK), they are already EPS students and **do not need** to be reenrolled. Before end of school year, your student's teacher will send you forms to be completed and returned to your school:

- Everett Ready Registration Form
- Kindergarten Questionnaire
- Kindergarten Transportation
- Updated Certificate of Immunization




Immunization Status & Health History



IMPORTANT

- Make sure that your child's vaccination is completed before their 1st day of school attendance:
 - Everett Ready August 19 or
 - 1st day of school September 9
- Complete / submit the 'Annual Health History' by mid-July, at the latest, if your child:
 - has a life-threatening condition / a medical plan and
 - will be attending Everett Ready.





Before / After School Care



EPS partners with the **YMCA** and the **Boys and Girls Club** to provide before and after school care at many of our schools.

There are also community childcare programs that transport students to and from some schools for before and after school care.

Once your student is enrolled, contact your neighborhood school to find out what options are available for the 2024-2025 school year.

Transportation





Bus Transportation

- Provided for students who reside outside a half-mile radius of the school
- Designated bus stops located along routes in central locations
- Routes are available on the district website prior to the start of school
- Route information is communicated to families via automated phone call and email prior to start of school
- All students have assigned seats with kindergartners in front of bus

Students:

- may purchase* either a hot or cold meal at school

- Plan to attend Everett Ready
 - Monday, August 19 to Thursday, August 22 (current dates)
 - www.everettsd.org/everettready
- Develop a consistent home and bedtime routine.
- Help your child learn their personal information (first and last name)
- Purchase school supplies. Supply list will be posted on PCE website in late spring.
- Visit the school playground over the summer.
- Label coats, backpacks, lunchboxes and water bottles.

Communications



STAY CONNECTED

ParentSquare (replacing current apps) keeps you updated through phone call, text messages and email. When you register with your school, make sure you enter up to date contact information and you will receive emergency messages, absences, school and district information and more.





District App combines content from the parent alert system, district website, district social media sites and the parent and student portals to provide a one-stop-shop for information. Push notifications are used in emergencies. Download the free Everett Public Schools mobile app, available in the online iTunes and Google Play app stores.
