At EPS, Kindergarten begins with **Everett Ready** a transition-into-kindergarten program

- **Monday, August 18 to Thursday, August 21**
- Half-day: **3 hours / day** - 9:10-12:10 pm
- Transportation provided for qualified students (usually not the same bus routes/numbers as the regular school year)
- Family meeting on August 18 from 9:30-10:00 am

## Family Connection Meeting

- Welcomes you into the Washington K-12 system as partners in your child's education through a family conference with your child's teacher.
- The meetings take place during the first 3 school days when grades 1-12 students are starting school.
- This is an opportunity for you to get to know your child's teacher, share information about your child, and ask questions.

## Whole-Child Assessment

Helps kindergarten teachers learn about the skills and strengths of the children in their classrooms so they can meet the needs of each child.

## Early Learning Collaboration

Aligns practices of early learning professionals and kindergarten teachers to support smooth transitions for children.

# Plan – Do – Reflect (PDR)



## A model of play-based learning

### PLAN

Choice with intention

### DO

Develops competent thinkers, decision makers, & problem solvers

### REFLECT

Remembering & reflecting with analysis

- Enhances creativity, critical thinking & problem-solving
- Contributes to the development of self-regulation & social skills
  - Promotes physical well-being & coordination
    - Encourages reading & writing
  - Enhances communication & collaboration
    - Develops character & citizenship

# Multilingual Learner (ML) Program



- The program provides structured language acquisition instructions to students whose native language is not English and qualified Native American students
- Students are assessed measuring their speaking, listening, reading, and writing skills. Scores indicate if support is required
- ML services are available at all our schools
- **Students receive support in class or in a small group**



# Current Students (Preschool / Transitional Kindergarten)



If you have a student currently attending an EPS early learning program: ECEAP Preschool, Developmental Preschool (DPK), or Transitional Kindergarten (TK), they are already EPS students and **do not need** to be re-enrolled. Before end of school year, your student's teacher will send you forms to be completed and returned to your school for kindergarten:

- **Everett Ready** Registration Form
- Kindergarten Questionnaire
- Kindergarten Transportation
- Updated Certificate of Immunization

# Immunization Status & Health History



## IMPORTANT

- Make sure that your child's **vaccination** is completed before their 1<sup>st</sup> day of school attendance:
  - Everett Ready - August 18
  - or
  - 1<sup>st</sup> day of school – September 2
- Complete / submit the **'Annual Health History'** by mid-July, at the latest, if your child:
  - has a life-threatening condition / a medical plan
  - and**
  - will be attending Everett Ready.



# Before / After School Care



EPS partners with the **YMCA** to provide before and after school care at many of our schools.

There are also community childcare programs that transport students to and from schools for before and after school care.

# Transportation



## Bus Transportation

- Provided for students that reside outside a half-mile radius of the school
- Designated bus stops located along routes in central locations
- Routes are available on the district website prior to the start of school
- Route information is communicated to families via automated phone call and email prior to start of school
- All students have assigned seats with kindergartners in front of bus

# Food and Nutrition Services



## Students:

- may bring breakfast and/or lunch from home
- may purchase\* either a hot or cold meal at school



**Families** can set up an online account for school meals\*

**School meals** are prepared to be free of these allergens: peanuts, tree nuts, shellfish and pork. If your student has other allergies, you can submit a *Special Dietary Accommodation Request* form.

*\*Free and reduced meals are available. Meals provided at Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) sites are offered at no charge to families.*

## Kindergarten Readiness Guidelines

Parents and families have a very important role as their child's first teacher. Children learn in different ways and at different rates. They come to school with varying skills. These guidelines highlight some of the skills that will help your child be prepared for kindergarten. The list below suggests ways to work with your child to help him/her be successful in school.

Social/ Emotional	We are working on this	Yes, my child can do this
1 My child can follow 2-step directions consistently and is beginning to follow 3-step directions.		
2 My child can remember and follow routines (ex: dinner, bath, brush teeth, read bedtime story, go to bed).		
3 My child can tell about his/her own feelings (ex: I feel happy, I feel sad, I feel excited).		
4 My child can calm him/herself when frustrated or upset.		
5 My child can put on his/her own coat.		
6 My child can use the bathroom independently.		
7 My child can wash his/her hands.		
8 My child can put away toys, clean up small spills and pick up after him/herself.		
9 My child shares, takes turns and helps others.		
10 My child adjusts to new situations and/or people.		
11 My child plays cooperatively with others.		
12 My child can comfort others.		
13 My child has the opportunity to play regularly with the same friends his/her age.		

Physical	We are working on this	Yes, my child can do this
1 My child can run, jump and gallop.		
2 My child can stand on one foot.		
3 My child can throw and catch a large ball.		
4 My child can kick a ball.		
5 My child can cut using scissors.		
6 My child can hold and use a pencil.		
7 My child can buckle, zip, snap, and button.		

Language	We are working on this	Yes, my child can do this
1 My child can use words to express his/her thoughts and needs.		
2 My child can name and describe familiar things in his/her world.		
3 My child uses new words everyday.		
4 My child speaks clearly and is understood by most people.		
5 My child can speak in 4-6 word sentences.		
6 My child can talk about things that happened in the past, with details.		
7 My child can have a conversation on one topic with another person, taking turns talking.

Summer Bucket List to support kindergarten readiness	
<p>Parents and families have a very important role as their child's first teacher. Children learn in different ways and at different rates. They learn to learn with varying skills. The activities on below suggest some fun ways to work with your child this summer to help them be more ready for school. They can complete the bucket for more than one! Please fill.</p>	
<p><b>Social/Emotional</b> <span style="float: right;">E-0078</span></p>	
1	You Spin Spin Outside! Give two sets of directions each turn (in, under, over, stop, your hands and jump)
2	Follow directions and get ready for bed (turn on your alarm, wash, brush teeth, read bedtime story, go to bed)
3	Emotion game. Act out different emotions and see if your family can guess how you feel (act out excitement and how can you guess?)
4	Give a gift in your house that is safe when you get frustrated or sad. What will you do there to help you feel better?
5	Getting dressed and ready for a trip to the park or to school?
6	Tell a family member all the things you can do by yourself (get a snack, brush your teeth, get dressed)
7	Go a random sort of clothes. How do it make you feel?
8	Clean your room or play area
9	Do a chore to help your family at home
10	Take or bring to a new place you have never been
11	Share a toy with a friend or sibling
12	Plan and carry out a random act of kindness
13	Playing with a friend outside
<p><b>Physical</b> <span style="float: right;">E-0079</span></p>	
1	Play an outside family game
2	Use sidewalk chalk to create a line dance course. Draw straight, curly and zig zag lines to follow over the sidewalk
3	Play a game with a ball where you need to throw, catch and kick the ball
4	Play catch with a friend or family member - how many times can you catch the ball in a row without dropping it?
5	Use magazines, newspaper or junk outside to find things you like. Cut out the pictures and glue them to make a collage
6	Use sidewalk chalk to draw your favorite things
7	Practice skip, jump, and hop like an animal as you are ready for kindergarten
<p><b>Language</b> <span style="float: right;">E-0080</span></p>	
1	Act out your favorite story
2	Play I spy, bring a nature walk with an adult! See how close you can get if they can guess what you spy!
3	Talk about the weather - how many words can you use to describe it? (sunny like, storm like, rainy like?)
4	Draw a picture of your favorite animal. Tell a family member as many details as you can about your animal
5	Ask a family member that plays out the with you and tell them about your kindergarten summer bucket list
6	Ask a family member to tell you a story about what they were a kindergarten
7	Tell a family member a story about something funny that happened to you
