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Math Curriculum

Everett School District has adopted the Open-up Resource Math Curriculum for Middle School. Students will have student workbooks for each unit. The curriculum can also be accessed online through Canvas at https://www.everettsd.org/domain/218

Grades

Grades will be available online and updated regularly. Students are responsible to monitor their grades often. Please contact me as soon as possible if you have a concern or question about a grade.

Grades are broken into two categories.

- **Assessments** make up 70% of your overall grade.
- **Assignments** (classwork and homework) make up 30% of your overall grade.

Summative assessments may be corrected for a better grade, up to 85% (B).

- Students must complete an additional practice for the unit.
- Students then must complete test corrections during a time prearranged with their teacher (lunch or before/after school).
- ALL test corrections must be completed before the next unit assessment!!

Homework & Late Work

- Students will be assigned practice problems as homework each night.
 - Parents, refer to the planner for what your child should be completing.
- Late work will be accepted anytime during the current math unit.
 - After we complete a unit test, late work will <u>not</u> be accepted for that unit.
