NOTES FROM THE MAIN OFFICE

Hello Evergreen Families and Students!

Here we are at the beginning of a new year and it is going to be a great year. Staff have been planning and preparing for weeks now and we can't wait to see our students! We are all looking forward to students being in the building after a hopefully, long and restful summer.

You can expect to receive this newsletter on a weekly basis as there is always a lot of great stuff to share!

Here are some key pieces of information that may help you plan for this week:

Picture Day is Tuesday!

All students will be getting their pictures taken this coming Tuesday (9/13). There will be retakes on a later date for those students who aren't at school this Tuesday. Students received order forms to bring home this week if you wanted to order pictures or learn more.

Chromebooks:

Students at Evergreen MS receive a Chromebook device to support their learning. These devices are checked out to the student through our library system. Students will receive a stylus and a charger to go with their device. This check out process will take place over the first five days of school.

PE Clothing: Students can purchase and wear clothing provided from the school or they are welcome to wear clothing from home. They are required to wear a light colored t-shirt (or sweatshirt) that students can write their names on. They are welcome to wear PE style shorts, sweatpants, or other soft fabric pants in a darker color. Shoes must be soft bottomed and they need to be the type that do not leave dark marks on the flooring. Please call the main office if you are interested in purchasing any PE clothing. Students do not need PE clothing for the first week of school.

Therefore, if you need to update your email, please do that with our front office.

WORLD LANGUAGE ASSESSMENTS

The **World Language Assessment** is a wonderful opportunity for students in grades 7-12 to receive recognition for their proficiency in reading, writing, speaking, and understanding a language other than English, earn additional high school world language credits, and free up space in class schedules. Qualifying students may earn the Seal of Biliteracy, special recognition that is very meaningful for many students and families.



Registration costs \$10 and is open through September 30. Fall testing will take place in mid-late October. Spring test registration will open January 3 and testing will take place in mid-February.

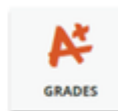

LMS applications offer parents and students secure online access to student information. What can I use my parent account for?

LMS parent/guardian accounts allow parents to access to the following systems:

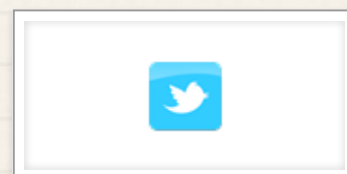

Parent accounts allow parents to login in as an observer to their student(s) within the platform. Parents will be able to view content, message teachers, help their student stay on track.</p> <p>* Parents will also receive notifications from Canvas for Announcements, Assignments, Discussions, Calendar reminders, etc</p>
	<p>District App The app allows parents to have all their online resources and communications in one hub. Parents can manage their district communications here. By default, parents will receive messages in the format of phone, email and text. Within the app, parents can set a preference*.</p> <p>*Parents must have at least one method of communication, they cannot remove all modes.</p>

BIG CHANGES WITH SCHOOL MEALS FOR 2022-23 (FREE BREAKFAST & LUNCH FOR OUR STUDENTS)



There are big changes happening with school meals for the 2022-23 school year that are important for you to understand. As we continue to return to 'normal,' the USDA is no longer able to extend the 'free meals for all' waiver we have appreciated the last two school years.

However, our state recently passed a new bill that eases the transition, called the Community Eligibility Provision, or CEP for short. CEP is a free meal service option for schools and school districts who have a 40 percent or higher number of students who qualify for free and reduced lunch.

Everett Public Schools worked hard to group the largest number of schools possible that kept the average percentage above the program threshold and because of this, 18 of our schools qualify for this program, including our school.


This means that breakfast and lunches are free to all students at these schools, regardless of free and reduced lunch qualifications.

Families at these schools will fill out a household income report, which has been emailed directly to you, in place of the free and reduced lunch application. This report is important to provide students access to free waivers and other services.

We are so excited to be able to use this new program to offer free meals to the students in our district who may need some extra support and to all of our students, no matter where they

learn, we will continue to offer nutritious and delicious meals that include seasonal fresh fruits and vegetables, scratch-made whole grain foods and lean proteins, with vegetarian and gluten free options too.

There has never been a better time to eat school meals. We look forward to serving you soon.

The Community Eligibility Provision (CEP)


What Does It Mean For Your School or Local Educational Agency?

What does it do?

- Allows schools and local educational agencies (LEAs) located in low-income areas to provide free breakfast and lunch to all students
- Eliminates the burden of collecting household applications to determine eligibility for school meal programs

Who benefits? Everyone!

- **Students**
Access to free nutritious meals for all students, no stigma, and less time spent in cashier lines and more time to eat nutritious meals
- **Parents**
No household application means less paperwork and no worries about lunch accounts
- **School staff**
Streamlined meal service operation and more time for students to consume their food
- **Administrators**
Reduced paperwork and administrative costs, no need to track unpaid meal charges, improved program integrity, and more nourished students ready to learn and grow



Who can participate?

- Schools and LEAs with a minimum Identified Student Percentage (≥40 percent) in the prior school year

Identified students = those certified for free meals without the use of household applications (for example those directly certified through SNAP).

- Available to:
 - All schools in an LEA
 - A group of schools in an LEA
 - An individual school in an LEA

Background

- Authorized by Congress as a part of the Healthy, Hunger-Free Kids Act of 2010.
- Phased in over a period of 3 years, starting with D.C., Illinois, Kentucky, Michigan, New York, Ohio, West Virginia, Florida, Georgia, Maryland, and Massachusetts.
- Available nationwide beginning July 1, 2014 (School Year 2014-15).

What must interested schools and LEAs do?

- Meet eligibility requirements.
- Serve free breakfasts and lunches to all students during the 4-year cycle.
- Count total breakfasts and total lunches served to students daily.
- Agree not to collect household applications for school meal programs.
- Determine if non-Federal funds are needed to cover costs above USDA reimbursement.

What do interested schools and LEAs do next?

- Determine if CEP is right for you.

COMMUNITY TRANSIT FREE TO YOUTH 18 AND UNDER

Starting September 1, youth 18 and under can ride all Community Transit services for free. That includes buses, DART paratransit service and vanpools (if they belong to a vanpool). Teens aged 13-18 are strongly encouraged to get a Youth ORCA card to use for fare "payment." ATTENDANCE PROCEDURES

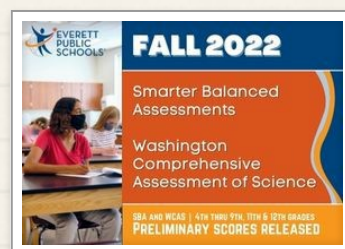


We look forward to seeing your child at school every day. Regular school attendance is important, and we will work with you to ensure your child is present to benefit from an excellent education. If your child is absent, please email the school at their attendance email address, which you can find on the school website.

If email is not possible, and even if you leave a message with the school attendance line, please send a written note to the school office within 30 days after your student returns to school.

SBA PRELIMINARY SCORES RELEASED

Smarter Balanced Assessment (SBA) student preliminary scores are available for families & students in the online Home Access Center (HAC). Families will also receive a hard copy in September.



Go to www.everettsd.org/SBAinformation to find tools for parents to understand those SBA scores.

How do I get the test scores? Under Quick Links, click How to view SBA scores for instructions. If you don't have a HAC account or have questions, contact LMS@everettsd.org. Washington Comprehensive Assessment of Science scores will be released in September. They will be put in HAC as soon as they arrive, and Individual Student Score Reports will be sent home through the normal school channels.

ACCESS YOUR FAMILY'S IMMUNIZATION INFORMATION

To access your family's immunization information from the Washington State registry visit, sign up for [MyIR](#) to view, download and print your student's immunization records securely online. Once you register, you can access the records anytime you need them. You can print your child's Certificate of Immunization Status for school, childcare and camp programs.

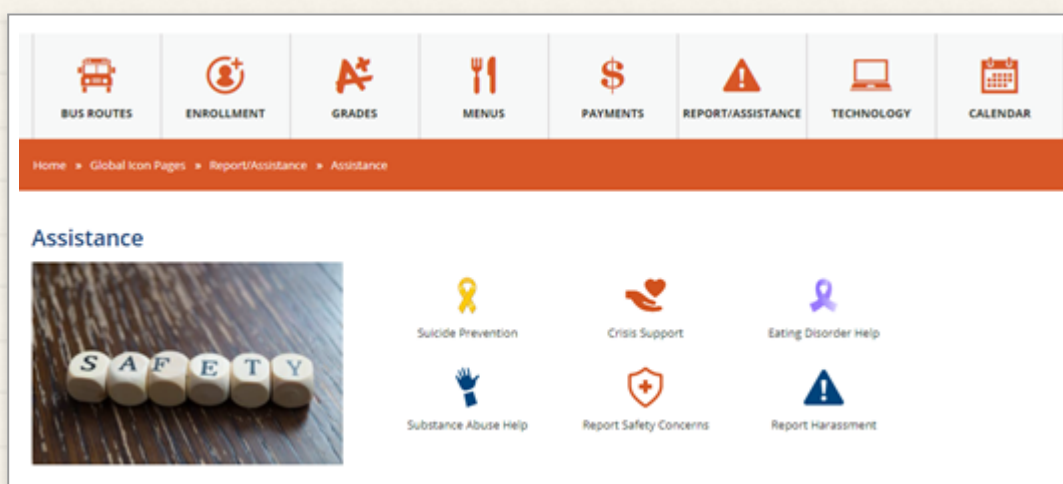

ECEAP PRESCHOOL ACCEPTING APPLICATIONS FOR 2022-23

Everett Public Schools Early Childhood Education & Assistance Program (ECEAP) is a FREE preschool program for three- and



four-year-old children from families with limited income. ECEAP prepares children for kindergarten and provides family support and health and nutrition services. It is funded by the Washington State Department of Children, Youth and Families.

The six ECEAP sites within our school district are Cedar Wood, Hawthorne, Jackson, Lowell, Madison, and Silver Lake elementary schools. We have both school-day classroom schedules and half-day (AM and PM) classroom schedules, depending on the school location. Space is limited – apply early! KIDS IN TRANSITION PROGRAM

Kids in Transition (KIT) program supports students who qualify for two federal programs which provide support for children and youth whose housing is highly mobile: those who meet the more inclusive definition of homeless under the federal [McKinney-Vento Homeless Act](#) and those who are eligible for [Foster Care Education support](#).



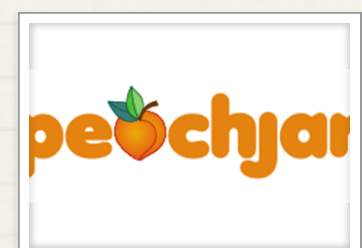
Students who are in foster care placement (where a child welfare agency has placement, care and authority) or those who are without a fixed, regular and adequate nighttime residence may qualify for this additional support.

The KIT program works to eliminate barriers to students' academic success and extra-curricular involvement. We ensure eligible students have access to free school meals, school supplies and uniforms. KIT may help students access extended day or summer school classes or coordinate access to additional academic support or tutoring when needed. The KIT Program may also cover, or coordinate waivers for, fees required to take part in activities such as school-sponsored sports, clubs, and required class fees. KIT can also help set up transportation for eligible students to maintain school stability, as long as the commute is feasible and in the best interest of the student. We also partner with the Family Resource Center and other community agencies to connect families and students to resources as needed.

STUDENT OPPORTUNITIES AND ACTIVITIES EFLYERS

ACCESS TO PUBLIC RECORDS

The district's records may be requested by the public, and many records are fully or partially available for public viewing. As our business is most often about students, families, and staff, some of the information contained in certain records may be protected under federal and state privacy laws.

YOUR STUDENT'S RECORDS ARE CONFIDENTIAL

Everett Public Schools is serious about protecting student records and privacy. The district uses multiple security measures to safeguard student transcripts and other education-related records. Only those teachers, administrators and other staff members who work directly with students (and have an educational need to know) have access to individual student records. Staff members are required to maintain confidentiality of all information in a student's records.
