

Can I volunteer?

Is there homework?

I will be sending home a packet at the beginning of the week. These are activities that students can do at home for you to see what we are learning and for extra practice. These are not officially graded in my gradebook. But, students will be rewarded for turning in their homework packet on Friday!

How will birthdays be celebrated?

Birthdays are so much fun and every student deserves to be celebrated! On their birthday, they will get a special birthday coupon to get one of our class rewards! They will also get special privileges throughout the day. I do ask though that you talk to me before sending in special treats. I need to make sure our class is allergy safe. Also, I don't want students and families to feel pressured to send in something if they aren't able to. If you are having a birthday party, you do not have to invite the whole class. But, if not everyone is invited, please have your students give the invites to me so that I can distribute them discreetly.

Can they bring stuff from home?

Students are expected to come to school each day with their backpack, folder, lunch (if needed) and a water bottle. Things like toys, special items, games, and electronics (including cellphones) are not allowed to come to school. We do not want things broken, stolen, or distracting the learning.
