- 1. <u>Medication Authorization/Order Form</u>: For all medications (includes prescribed and overthe-counter medications).
- 2. <u>Epinephrine & Antihistamine Authorization Form</u>: For treatment of life threatening allergies only.
- 3. Gastrostomy Tube Treatment Authorization Form: For gastrostomy feedings.
- 4. <u>Diabetic Order Form</u> for injectable Insulin & <u>Diabetic Insulin Pump Orders</u> for insulin pumps.

Important Summer Learning

While the summer break can be associated with rest, relaxation, and fun, it can also be detrimental in relation to the progress of student learning. We've all heard of the "summer slide" and the regression of academic skills that occurs over summer months. Much of that same research also suggests that students can keep their skills from that dramatic regression through brief, daily periods of reading, writing, and math.

At North, we encourage each of our families to frame this daily period as a combination of 1) reading/writing for enjoyment, and 2) a combination of math facts and problem solving. Our encouragement is to carve out sixty minutes (*that's only one of twenty-four hours or 4.16% of your day*) to focus on these important areas of learning. Below are a few helpful tips.

Multi-Genre Reading: Reading for enjoyment is key to our development as readers, writers, thinkers, and across our social lives. The enjoyment of a great series of books is key to enjoyable, sustained reading. On her website <u>Reading Middle Grades</u>, Afoma Umesi recommends a number of solid middle school reads including several series of books. Your local <u>librarian</u> can also help. Additionally, it is important to mix-in non-fictional texts. Check out the website <u>Teaching Expertise</u> for middle school specific nonfiction titles for consideration.

Writing as Daily Practice: Like everything, writing requires practice and the absence of intentional writing creates troubling gaps. To keep writing skills sharp, we ask our scholars to engage in writing for enjoyment as a daily practice. This does not need to be prolonged or challenging but rather, should be personal, creative, and enjoyable. The website Mamateaches provides several helpful summer prompts for consideration.

Keeping Your Problem Solving Skills Sharp: We all know the importance of remaining fluent in multiplication and division facts but other math skills and basic problem solving functions require our attention. Each of the below web resources houses outstanding summer problem solving opportunities.

In addition to the above, we highly encourage our North scholars to avoid the mental trap of doom scrolling and embrace our human need to create and explore. The acts of designing, building, or creating in any regard stimulates our <u>creative brains</u> and pushes us beyond being mere consumers to the empowering role of producing.

Finally, it is vital that we all remember the mind/body connection. Physical activity not only promotes a healthy lifestyle but also enhances our cognitive abilities. Each day, let's push ourselves to intentionally walk, run, bike, hike somewhere to increase our heartrates end explore the parks, trails, urban paths, and other features around us. Exploring together, whether it be simple or a trip to a museum or cultural event, creates stronger bonds, lasting memories, and healthier lives.

- Transportation Needs: As your family prepares for the coming school year, it is important
 to create clear transportation plan for before and after school. We ask that each
 student/family clearly understands how they will be getting home each day (bus, walking,
 or getting a ride from an adult). Should you need help with bus/transportation information,

 Transportation. Bus routes for the 2023/2024 school year will be updated across the
 coming weeks.
- **Before/After School:** Please remember that classes begin at 8:15am. As such, our students should not be on campus before 7:50am unless they are involved in a designated academic/arts activity. Additionally, we work to make sure that our students are either on their way home or involved in a school related activity by 3:00pm each day. If your child plans to stay on campus beyond 3:00pm, they will need to be part of a North sports team, club, ASB or have made previous arrangements with a teacher for academic help. We ask that families remain consistent in their after school plans. Should emergencies arise and

changes need to be made to after school plans, notifying us by 12:00pm/noon helps ensure that this information will be clearly communicated to/with your child.

- Accessing School Information through Home Access Center (HAC): Are you already signed up for Home Access Center (HAC)? HAC provides access to information such as student schedules, teachers' names and emails, attendance, and transportation. If you need access, please send an email to LMS@everettsd.org with your name, student name(s), student ID#, and the school(s) they attend. LMS will respond with your login/password to the email you have on file with the school. For more information, please click here.
- Immunizations: Current immunizations are required and help ensure a successful start to the new school year. Sixth grade parents should be aware that several immunizations expire between the 5th and 6th grade years. If you haven't already, please take the time over the coming weeks to make sure your child receives any immunizations that are due so that you can provide the documentation when you register your child. It is challenging for students who are not current on their immunizations to attend school consistently. For all Health Services information, please click here.

Middle School Athletics Update - Fall 2023

The start of our fall athletics season is fast approaching. To participate in the coming seasons of cross country, football, and girls softball, North scholars and families must complete the following:

- Deadlines for registration are one week prior to the first practice or tryout date. No late
 additions will be accepted for tryout sports. To register for a fall sport, please designate
 the sport that your child will be joining/participating via the immediately below Final
 Forms site.
- <u>Final Forms</u> All athletic forms will be completed online. The forms must be completed and signed in order to be eligible.
- Completed Physical A current physical needs to be uploaded into FinalForms (link above) before student athletes can participate. The valid physical form is typically good for two years. Please note that free sports physicals are available at Everett High School on Saturday, August 12th. Please click <u>here</u> for more information.
- Insurance All athletes must have insurance coverage. If you don't have insurance please contact our school office.
- Athletic Fee A \$40 athletic fee (per sport) must be paid before the first contest. Please
 note that softball, volleyball, basketball, and soccer typically require "tryouts" and not all
 students are able to participate. It is advised that families not pay for these sports until
 after team rosters have been posted. Should your family need assistance with the fee,
 please contact our school office.
- ASB Card A \$10 ASB card is required for all participating student-athletes. Should your family need assistance with the fee for this card, please contact our school office.

For access to your student's district email account go to www.office.com. Students can login with their studentID@apps.everettsd.org account and district password on any personal device using the web browser. Once logged in, select the Outlook icon located on the left side of the webpage.

Practices for our fall sports begin the first day of school (9/6). Be sure that your account shows compliant so that you are able to participate. Please note that Sixth graders may practice for the sports of cross country, wrestling, and track (if space is available) but not compete. As such, families of sixth graders are not responsible for the \$40 athletic fee.
