

Welcome Back Week - Orientation 2023!

Our Welcome Back Orientations are next week and we hope that you will join us, at your convenience, as we launch the coming year together. Orientations occur on two consecutive evenings, Tuesday, August 29th and Wednesday, August 30th. Families should plan to visit on either evening, anytime between 4:00pm and 7:00pm. Please see the below details including the information/details pertaining to any student health needs and/or medication.

Orientation 2023 Details:

- Dates: Tuesday, August 29th and Wednesday, August 30th
- Times: 4:00pm to 7:00pm (visit at your convenience)
- · Location: North Lobby, Commons, and Gyms
- Entrance: Please enter on either side of our school (east or west entrances).

During orientation kick-off, you will be able to...

- · Tour parts of our North campus
- Pick up a copy of your 2023/2024 class schedule
- Learn about our North athletics program and check your clearance status (important for fall sports)
- · Meet and learn more about becoming a member of our North PTA
- Skip the line for any payments by using our online payment system here. You can pay for yearbooks, ASB cards, and athletic fees.
- Turn in medications and health forms (including any of the below forms, as needed).
 Please remember that we cannot accept medications without the below, required
 Medication Authorization Form (below, #1).
- Note: Student/school pictures will not be taken as part of orientation. Our fall picture day is 9/12 and student IDs and ASB cards will be updated at this time.
- 1. <u>Medication Authorization/Order Form</u>: For all medications (includes prescribed and overthe-counter medications).
- 2. <u>Epinephrine & Antihistamine Authorization Form</u>: For treatment of life threatening allergies only.
- 3. Gastrostomy Tube Treatment Authorization Form: For gastrostomy feedings.
- 4. <u>Diabetic Order Form</u> for injectable Insulin & <u>Diabetic Insulin Pump Orders</u> for insulin pumps.

Back-to-School Notes:

- North Office Hours: Our North Office is currently open each day, from 8:00am to 3:00pm.
 Beginning Tuesday, 9/5, we will shift back to our regular school year hours, opening each day at 7:30am and closing at 4:00pm.
- Class Schedules: Class schedules for the 2023/2024 school year will be available our
 welcome back orientation (8/29, 8/30). If you are new to our district, please contact our
 school office to ensure your child's registration. Additionally, you can click here to view

- Bell Schedules: Schedules for the year are available here, including our recent shift to a six-period day. This schedule includes extended learning opportunities and a two-block lunch option during our fourth period (11:18am to 11:48am for our 6th graders and two concurrent, rotating lunches for our 7th and 8th graders from 12:17pm to 12:47pm. Please remember that both school breakfast and lunch are available to all of our students at no cost.
- **Supplies:** Please <u>click here</u> for our school supplies list. Should students have any needs in this regard, our team will work to provide accordingly.
- Transportation Needs: As your family prepares for the coming school year, it is important
 to create clear transportation plan for before and after school. We ask that each
 student/family clearly understands how they will be getting home each day (bus, walking,
 or getting a ride from an adult). Should you need help with bus/transportation information,
 please click here to access EPS Transportation and our district partner, Durham
 Transportation. Bus routes for the 2023/2024 school year will be updated across the
 coming weeks.
- Before/After School: Please remember that classes begin at 8:15am. As such, our students should not be on campus before 7:55am unless they are involved in a designated academic/arts activity. Additionally, we work to make sure that our students are either on their way home or involved in a school related activity by 3:00pm each day. If your child plans to stay on campus beyond 3:00pm, they will need to be part of a North sports team, club, ASB or have made previous arrangements with a teacher for academic help. We ask that families remain consistent in their after school plans. Should emergencies arise and changes need to be made to after school plans, notifying us by 12:00pm/noon helps ensure that this information will be clearly communicated to/with your child.
- Accessing School Information through Home Access Center (HAC): Are you already signed up for Home Access Center (HAC)? HAC provides access to information such as student schedules, teachers' names and emails, attendance, and transportation. If you need access, please send an email to LMS@everettsd.org with your name, student name(s), student ID#, and the school(s) they attend. LMS will respond with your login/password to the email you have on file with the school. For more information, please click here.
- Immunizations: Current immunizations are required and help ensure a successful start to the new school year. Sixth grade parents should be aware that several immunizations expire between the 5th and 6th grade years. If you haven't already, please take the time over the coming weeks to make sure your child receives any immunizations that are due so that you can provide the documentation when you register your child. It is challenging for students who are not current on their immunizations to attend school consistently. For all Health Services information, please click here.

Traffic Flow and Entrances/Exits - Arrival & Dismissal

Safe arrivals and dismissals are essential and we appreciate/value all of our families in helping us care for our students. As you consider drop-off/arrival and pick-up/dismissal, please review the following.

Arrival:

- Our campus/building does not open until 7:55am. We encourage families to refrain from dropping-off your children early as supervision is not available prior to 7:55am.
- As noted below, our busses arrive via our west lot and entrance. For this reason, we ask
 that families not utilize this lot/entrance unless parking/proceeding to the Front Office.
- Vehicle drop-off takes place heading south along Rainier, with students utilizing our east entrance. Please do not drop off heading north as this causes students to risk crossing the street during a busy time.
- All students may proceed either to the commons for breakfast or (6th graders) to the atrium and (7th/8th graders) to the covered area that is north of our main gym.
- If you need to arrive late (after 8:15am) please utilize our west lot/entrance. Students will need to acquire a pass before proceeding to class.

North Way Arrival Expectations

Starting our day in a positive and structured way prepares us to do our best learning

Safe:


- · Arrive no earlier than 7:55am
- Before 8:05am, students will need to wait in designated areas (see map) or eat breakfast in our commons

Respectful:

 Students are expected to greet others w/ respect and dignity when entering

Responsible:

- Students are expected to bring all of the materials that they will need for the day
- Students are required to turn off/put away cell phones and electronics prior to entering the building
- · Classes begin at 8:15am



Dismissal:

- Similar to the morning/arrival, students riding home by bus will exit our west doors to board waiting busses at the curb.
- Students who are being picked-up or walking home will exit the east doors to Rainier Ave.

• Students who are staying on campus for athletics, clubs, tutoring, etc. will proceed to the designation location for that activity.

North Way Dismissal Expectations

Safe:


- · Walking at all times, especially when using stairs
- · Walk all bicycles, scooters, and skateboards off campus
- · Use sidewalks and crosswalks
- · Leave campus immediately at the end of the day

Respectful:

- · Be aware of others, stay on the right
- · Keep hands and feet to yourself
- · Do not delay by stopping for conversation

Responsible:

- Cell phones should not be used until students are outside of our North building
- Make sure that you have a plan for how you are getting home (arranged ride, know bus route, etc.)

Dress Code Reminder

We are grateful for your partnership in ensuring that our students arrive prepared and ready for the day, including wearing clothing that is appropriate for their learning and the learning of others. Our dress code expectations are specifically aligned with our Everett Pubic Schools, specifically Policy 3224 and the related procedure, 3224P. As such, our North students should be able to dress in a style and manner that positively represents themselves and others. Clothing (style and manner) that creates a material and/or substantial disruption will not be permitted. If student dress is not in compliance with the above-noted policies, they will be required to make appropriate corrections which may involve families delivering new articles of clothing that align accordingly with our school/district expectations.

Again, we thank you for your attention and partnership in this matter.

Tardy Incidents and Cell Phone Violations

As noted last month, North will be implementing the <u>Student Conductor</u> system for the coming year, specific to incidents of being tardy (late to class) and cell phone violations. Our Student Conductor system will help us better support students and, as needed, provide timely communication to families.

In particular, when a student is marked tardy for a class, the parent/guardian will receive an email notification informing you that your child has been tardy. We understand that students can be late for a variety of reasons and each student will receive four free tardy incidents each semester. Teachers will still be able to write a tardy pass for students who may be late to their next class due to an excused reason. This will not count toward their four warnings. If a student receives more than four unexcused tardy incidents within a defined period of time, they will receive a consequence such as lunch detention and/or Friday after-school detention. In extreme cases of excess tardies, students may receive an in-school suspension. It is our hope, each student will arrive to class on time and be prepared to learn.

Likewise, when a student violates our school/district cell phone policy, parents/guardians will again receive an email notification informing you. Students will be required to turn in their cell phone where it will be stored in a secure location until end of the day. Similar to when they are marked tardy, students will have a progressive consequence ladder including warnings, lunch detention, Friday after-school detention, etc. Please be sure to check our North 2023/24 Student Handbook for more information and details.

As part of our upcoming Opening Week (9/6, 9/7, and 9/8), our students will be provided detailed information related to these new systems and processed. Additionally, you will receive ongoing updates as we implement and uphold these practices across the coming year.

Fall Athletics Reminder

Practices for our fall sports begin on our Opening Day (9/6), including cross country, football, and girls softball. Please remember that registration must be completed one week prior to our first practice or (if relevant) tryout. This means that registration via <u>Final Forms</u> is due by this coming Wednesday, 8/30. For additional information, please see our overview update in last month's <u>mid-summer update</u>.

Co-Teaching at North

At North, some of our classroom learning environments utilize a collaborative instructional pairing known as "co-teaching." This approach involves two or more teachers working together to co-lead the same learning environment in the same classroom. This collaborative approach allows us to enhance student learning, especially for students who may be coming to school with increase needs.

Co-teaching only occurs within a handful of our North classrooms but continues to be a instructional practice that shows promise in helping us meet the needs of all of our learners. For additional information on co-teaching, please see the below, related documents.
