From the Assistant Principal

Dear Vikings,

As we embrace the crisp November air, we want to provide you with important reminders on attendance and how it impacts your child's education at View Ridge Elementary.

Tardies and Unexcused Absences:

We want to remind you that three tardies in our school system equal one unexcused absence. While we understand that unforeseen circumstances may occasionally lead to tardiness, consistent tardies can impact your child's learning experience. Regular attendance is crucial to ensuring they have every opportunity to succeed academically. Please review our school hours:

- 9:10am- 1st bell
- 9:15am- 2nd bell; any students who arrive past this time will be considered tardy

Chronic Absenteeism:

Chronic absenteeism is a matter we take seriously. It includes any student who misses 10% or more of school days for any reason. This translates to approximately 18 or more days in a school year. Chronic absenteeism can significantly impede your child's progress and their ability to benefit fully from our educational programs.

- Missing 2 or more days per month can be considered chronically absent.

The Importance of Consistent Attendance:

Every day of school offers valuable learning experiences and opportunities for your child to grow academically and socially. When a student is frequently absent, they miss out on essential instruction and interaction with peers. Moreover, regular school attendance helps establish a sense of routine, responsibility, and discipline that is valuable for their future. If there is anything we can do to help you and your child with getting to school every day, on time, please let us know.

How You Can Help:

- 1. Establish a Routine: Set a consistent schedule for bedtime and wake-up time to ensure your child is well-rested and ready to start the school day on time.
- 2. Open Communication: If your child is unable to attend school due to illness or a family emergency, please notify the school office as soon as possible (Attendance Line: <u>VREAttendance@everettsd.org</u> or 425-385-5405)
- 3. Monitor Tardies: Keep an eye on your child's tardiness to prevent it from accumulating into unexcused absences.
- 4. Plan Vacations Wisely: Whenever possible, schedule family vacations during school breaks to minimize disruptions to your child's education.

Thank you for your partnership in your child's education. By working together, we can provide them with the best educational experience and set them on a path to a bright future.

Changes to a student's daily going home plan:

Occasionally, you may need to change the plan of how your child is going home at the end of the school day. If this is the case for your family, we ask that a guardian sends an email to the classroom teacher AND calls the school office at 425-385-5400 no later than 2:45 pm OR at least 45 minutes before school gets out when school dismissal is an Early Release or Learning Improvement Friday. Please include the name of your student, their teacher, and the change of plan. Our office will then deliver this information to your student. This method of communication helps to support our staff with accurate dismissal information.

View Ridge Attendance Corner:

Regular school attendance is important, and we will work with you to ensure your child is present to benefit from an excellent education. If your student is absent or tardy from school, please email every day the attendance office at vreattendance@everettsd.org or call at 425-385-5405 to let us know the reason for the absence or tardy.



If email is not possible, and even if you leave a message with the school attendance line, please send a written note to the school office within 30 days after your student returns to school.

PE Corner with Mr. Wheeler and Ms. King:

The bike unit has begun for grades 3-5. In this unit students will be learning how to be safe and dependable riders and pedestrians. During this program, all students will be given helmets and bikes and will be instructed on how to properly fit a helmet. Please help your student to have proper fitting helmets using the tips below:

Helmet Fit



Eyes

Helmet should be level and cover your upper forehead. You should be able to fit no more than one or two fingers between your eyebrows and the brim of the helmet. Once the helmet is level, turn the dial at the back of the helmet to snug up the inner band to prevent the helmet from wiggling side-to-side. If there's no dial, use thicker fit pads where there is space at the front, back and/or sides of the helmet to get a snug fit. Move the pads around to touch your head evenly all the way around.



Ears

Helmet side straps should meet to form a "Y" just below your earlobes.



Mouth

Chin strap should be buckled and snug below your chin, so that no more than one or two fingers fit under the strap. If you open your mouth wide, you should feel the helmet pulling down on the top of your head.



Our throwing and catching unit wrapped up with a fun carnival game lesson in the gym. The children enjoyed this activity.

There is a new, free mental health referral service for children and teens 17 and younger run through Children's Hospital. Families can access the service by calling (833) 303-5437, M-F 8am to 5 pm to be connected with a referral specialist. Approximately 2 weeks after intake, families will receive information for one or two recommended providers that meet your criteria (i.e. in person, preferred language, time, etc). I have heard from several families that it has been difficult to find outside counseling, and this service has high family satisfaction ratings, so please take advantage! 



RECEIVE INFORMATION THE WAY YOU PREFER

This is a friendly reminder that parents and guardians can select their preferred method of communication so they will not get the same message in multiple formats unless they choose to. Below are some steps to take:

- Download the district's mobile app. One of the many features is to select your delivery preferences. Once you have signed into your account, click on your profile tile and then "Edit Delivery Preferences" at the top.
 - Click on the icon for app, text, phone or email to turn off that mode. Green indicates the mode is turned on. Some modes are locked, as indicated with the lock in the upper corner of the icon.
- Keep your contact information current by updating the "Annual Student Update Form 2023-2024" in Home Access Center or by letting your school office know anytime there is a change.
- Please visit the communications department webpage for a list of timely and relevant information to strengthen connections among families, staff and community.





IMPORTANT FAFSA/WASFA CHANGES

Big changes are coming to financial aid applications this year! The 2024-25 FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) will not be available until December 2023. The WASFA (Washington Application for State Financial Aid) will also be delayed until the FAFSA opens.



Applications usually open October 1 of a student's senior year, so this is a major shift in the college planning process. The good news is that this delay is due to positive changes. The FAFSA form will be shorter and less complex, more students will be eligible for federal Pell Grants, and the average Pell award will be larger. Stay tuned for more information and find resources from the Washington Student Achievement Council.

ONLINE SAFETY TIPS

- Keep the computer in a busy area of your home.
- Use an app to keep an eye on your child's online activity on their device.
- Talking about cyberbullying; ask if someone they know has been a victim. Ask if they have been victimized.
- Set up email and social media accounts with your children. Know their screen names and passwords and explain the reasons for not including any personal information in profiles.

Know who is in the "buddy lists." Get to know the cyberfriends just as you do those who visit your home. Parents and guardians may find the following resources helpful to begin a conversation about the dangers of engaging in cyberbullying and how to stay safe online:
