From the Counseling Center

Pre-Registration for 2022-2023

Course pre-registration for the 2022-2023 school year is February 28–March 31. The Counseling Department is excited to continue the online course registration process through Home Access Center (HAC). Students will watch a pre-registration video in their 2nd period class on **Monday, February 28**. The video will be available on our website for students and parents to view any time, and the district high school course catalog for 2022-2023 will be linked on our website.

Following the kick-off video on February 28, students will attend advisory sessions with their counselor to get guidance on choosing classes. These are scheduled for 5th period during the school day, and each student will be notified of their designated advisory session. Counselors can also assist with credit checks during pre-registration. Referring to their transcript, which they can find in HAC, students need to complete the Graduation Checklist included in the course catalog and determine what requirements they still need to take for graduation. Videos on how to access HAC will be available. Based on credits they still need and their post-high school plans, students will select their course requests and alternates and then log on to HAC to input their selections directly from home.

Parents, please ask your student to review their pre-registration information with you. Remember that our course catalog is a common catalog for all our district secondary schools, so it's important to check the "Location" information for each course in the catalog to ensure your student only selects courses offered at Jackson. Students should talk to their teachers to explore potential AP placement.

More pre-registration information will be shared in March.

Mid-Year College Reports

After 1st semester grades are posted (in mid-February), counselors will complete the mid-year report. This will pull students' updated transcripts, which will include 1st semester grades (*don't worry—the timing of this will work with the colleges to which seniors are applying!*). Later this spring, when students know where they plan to attend, students will note that detail in Naviance. That notation will alert our registrar where to send students' *final* JHS transcripts after they graduate in June.

As we continue through this school year, the counselors would like to offer you a place to go to find tools and strategies to manage stress, process emotions, and take a moment to experience some calm. The Virtual Calming Room includes several resources for students of all ages and the adults in their lives.

SAT on March 23

All juniors have been enrolled to take the school-day SAT on **Wednesday, March 23**. There is nothing your student needs to do to sign up for this exam. Although the majority of colleges no longer consider examination scores for fall 2022 admission, the SAT can still be used to measure a student's readiness for college. There are several ways your student can practice for this test. [College Board](#) offers free practice options online. Also, College Board has collaborated with the [Khan Academy](#) to offer free practice for the SAT. This site offers interactive problems, video lessons, full-length practice tests, and a personalized study plan. There are also full-length [Online SAT Practice Tests](#) that simulate taking the actual SAT. All these options are free through the College Board.

Dual language Spanish Immersion Program

The dual language Spanish immersion program at Emerson Elementary School is an option for fall 2022. Families with children entering kindergarten will have the option to choose the dual language strand. This program gives elementary students an opportunity to complete the Everett Public Schools curriculum in a nontraditional and exciting way by immersing them in Spanish language and culture from kindergarten through twelfth grade. Students in the program will become proficient in both Spanish and English while learning the same curriculum content as their peers outside the program.

Priority will be given to students within the Emerson Elementary School attendance area. If a high number of students apply, a lottery will be conducted to select students. If the class is not filled from those in the Emerson attendance area, an additional lottery from beyond the school attendance area will be conducted.

Programa de inmersión al español con lenguaje dual

El programa de inmersión al español con lenguaje dual (en inglés como “dual-language Spanish immersion program”) de la escuela primaria de Emerson es una opción disponible para el otoño 2022.
