

As I write the last Principal's Message for the 2022-2023 newsletter, I am incredibly grateful to have the opportunity to lead such an amazing student body and staff! It has been a full year packed with many accomplishments and a long list of incredible work.

Washington State Honors Award Program

Each year our state recognizes outstanding academic achievement by issuing the Washington State Honors Award to the top 10% of the Washington State high school graduating class. This award is based on their ACT or SAT scores, cumulative GPA, and meeting core requirements.

This year at Jackson High School we have **84** seniors who received this award! This means that 84 of our seniors are in the **top 10%** of the state for this award!

Advanced Placement

One of the primary goals of our district's strategic plan is to graduate 100% of our students college- and career-ready. In May we administered 1,760 AP exams to over 900 students.

Message from the Counseling Center

Class of 2023

<u>High School & Beyond Plan Tasks:</u> There are 5 key SENIOR TASKS required by Washington State that are tied to your HS & Beyond Plan and need to be completed to graduate (see previous email sent to you with specific tasks to complete, if any). Although you have taken the College & Career Readiness Seminar class requirement at the high school, or via a course equivalency, you are still responsible for the graduation tasks associated with your High School & Beyond Plan.

<u>Final Transcripts for Seniors:</u> Naviance is also the program seniors will use to request final transcripts for colleges. You will be sent an email in June on how to do this, and you can also find this on the HSBP WEBSITE. Your final transcripts will be sent out *by our Registrar* after 2nd semester grades are finalized in late June. Note: Colleges and universities understand that high schools finish at differing times; thus, they are flexible with this timing.



- 9 College Application Tasks for the Summer Before Senior Year
- <u>Guaranteed Admissions Program (GAP)</u>: The Guaranteed Admissions Program supports a college-going culture and guaranteed admission efforts at <u>Central Washington University</u>, <u>Eastern Washington University</u>, <u>The Evergreen State College</u>, <u>Washington State University</u>, and <u>Western Washington University</u>. Together, and in partnership with our communities, we are committed to meeting the college and career goals of Washington students to increase access and credential completion in Washington through GAP.
- The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) is changing! "Due to the major changes, the U.S. Department of Education's Office of Federal Student Aid has indicated they will be ready to offer the simplified application for the upcoming cycle. They are delaying the release until December 2023, two months after the usual October 1 release." Stay tuned for more updates as they are released.

Congratulations on your pending graduation! While graduation is an exciting celebration, it is also a dignified and distinguished ceremony that you and your family will look back on for years to come. For the ceremony, your graduation regalia will represent Henry M. Jackson High School, and the recognition of what you earned while a student here.

There is also celebratory time after the formal ceremony where regalia expectations become less formal. Please refer to the information below for what is appropriate for the ceremony and post-celebrations.

Graduation Regalia - Allowed during formal graduation ceremonies

- · Gear provided by the school (cap, gown, school stole, tassel)
 - A stole is for academic achievement, a sash is celebratory and for after
- Academic Cords (GPA requirement)
- School-provided approved club cords (for example: NHS, DECA, Thespian society, ROTC, AVID, that have a national recognition attached to them)
- Tribal regalia can be on caps or in lieu of caps*
- Sno-Isle National Technical Honor Society stole and tassel (white) (EPS school stole
 must be worn on top)
- Orca Stole (EPS school stole must be worn on top)
- · AA stole (EPS school stole must be worn on top)

Post-Graduation Ceremony Regalia (*common items listed below)

- Money leis
- Candy leis
- Flower leis
- Cultural/Nation of Origin stoles
- Sashes

*Culturally Significant Representations: In accordance with the American Indian Religious Freedom Act, sovereign tribal nations may wear traditional regalia and other items of cultural significance during graduation. Adornments of cultural significance are acceptable with prior approval from the Principal or Principal designee by Friday, June 2nd, provided they:

- Are school appropriate.
- Reflect a culture that you identify with; for example, Native Hawaiian and Pacific Islander students may wear flower/leaf leis as an item of cultural significance, and respecting this cultural significance, we ask that students who do not self-identify as Native Hawaiian and Pacific Islander refrain from wearing leis
- Do not change or replace the school issued items (including caps, which are not to be decorated);
- Are not potentially disruptive to the ceremony or detrimental to the safety and welfare of other students



FAQs on JHS 2023 Grad Night



What is Grad Night?

Since the opening of Jackson, Senior Class family members have put on an activity-filled overnight event for JHS seniors to celebrate the night of graduation with their friends in a safe and sober environment. This event is not associated with the school or district; it is a purely volunteer group!

Who organizes the event?

The JHS Class of 2023 Parent Group has a 6-member board voted in at a parent meeting last summer, and we are all parents of JHS 2023 students. We are registered with the State of Washington and the IRS as a nonprofit entity and we are insured. Our primary social media is a Facebook group called "Class of 2023 – Jackson 12 Grade Parents" (www.facebook.com/groups/2191865780877452) or you can contact us at jhs2023parents@gmail.com.

What about event details and security?

We contracted with a licensed and insured event vendor. The business has a long-standing reputation in the area and professional relationships with our multiple venues. They will provide food, security and ensure a safe and positive grad party experience. No other schools will be at our venues and no JHS students will be allowed if not pre-registered with us.

This event is at a secret location?

That's right, your student will not know the event site until graduation! We will work to answer as many questions as you or your student might have without revealing exact location.

When does the event happen?

We will load up Durham school buses at JHS around 10 p.m. the night of graduation (June 17). We will return to JHS around 6 a.m. Food will be provided early in the evening, and again early in the morning.

What if my student has special dietary or medical needs?

Please let us know if your student has any special needs so we can address it with our vendor ahead of time and work to confidentially facilitate your student's experience.

How much does it cost?

Grad Night is \$165 per student. That price goes up to \$195 on April 1. ALL funds go directly to the party and transportation. Any leftover funds will roll forward to Class of 2024 Parent Group. report the damage.
Wrap your charger cord neatly and securely.
Remove any stickers or decals from your computer.




Athletes of the Month, March






Athletics Updates

Girls Golf



Family Resource Center

Everett School District's <u>Family Resource Center</u> (FRC), which is part of our Kids in Transition (KIT) Program, is celebrating the completion of its first full school year in operation. The FRC mainly serves EPS families experiencing homelessness or housing instability, supporting them while they navigate the various social service programs in the community.



The FRC serves as a hub for a limited supply of donated basic needs items and provides a welcoming space for our students and families to receive support, have some basic needs met, and connect to school and community resources. Families are identified and referred to the FRC by KIT building point people located in each school throughout the district.

Since its inception, FRC staff has built valuable partnerships with many community agencies, which has helped to better serve Everett Public Schools' families. As of mid-May, the FRC has connected almost 200 families to community resources, 60 families specifically to housing services, supplied over 100 families with basic needs items (including clothing, hygiene items, and diapers), and distributed over 1,000 pounds of food.

Este año, las EPS se asociarán con una serie de nuevas organizaciones comunitarias para ofrecer comidas gratuitas del 5 de julio al 18 de agosto. 

Centro de Recursos Familiares

El <u>Centro de Recursos Familiares</u> (Family Resource Center, FRC) del Distrito de Escuelas de Everett, que es parte de nuestro programa categórico de Niños en Transición (Kids in Transition, KIT), está celebrando la finalización de su primer año escolar completo en operación. El FRC atiende principalmente a familias de las EPS que se encuentran en situación de carencia de hogar o inestabilidad en la vivienda, apoyándolas mientras exploran por los diversos programas de servicios sociales de la comunidad.

El FRC sirve como centro para un suministro limitado de artículos de primera necesidad donados y brinda un espacio acogedor para que nuestros estudiantes y familias reciban apoyo, satisfagan algunas necesidades básicas y se conecten con recursos escolares y comunitarios. Las familias son identificadas y remitidas al FRC por las personas de contacto de KIT ubicadas en cada escuela del distrito.



Desde su creación, el personal del FRC ha establecido valiosas asociaciones con muchas agencias de la comunidad, lo que ha ayudado a servir mejor a las familias de las Escuelas Públicas de Everett. Hasta mediados de mayo, el FRC había puesto en contacto a casi 200 familias con recursos comunitarios, en concreto a 60 familias con servicios de vivienda, había suministrado a más de 100 familias artículos de primera necesidad (ropa, artículos de higiene y pañales) y distribuido más de 1,000 libras de alimentos.
