An all-school lunch will begin at 11:00 a.m. Shortened classes will be held after that, starting with 1st period at 11:40 p.m.

Bus service will be **3.5 hours late** for all 9th, 11th, and 12th grade students who are not taking the test. *For example, if your student is normally picked up at 6:15 a.m., they would instead be picked up at 9:45 a.m. (3.5 hours later).*

11th grade students who wish to register must pay the \$25 cost for testing at the ASB office, cash or check only. Seats are limited and will be filled on a first-come, first-served basis.

Sno-Isle TECH Students: Students who are scheduled to test should be testing at JHS and should not attend Sno-Isle that day. Students who are <u>not</u> testing should still attend Sno-Isle. Transportation will be provided at the front entrance at 7:30 a.m. like usual with no interruptions. When Sno-Isle students return, they should report to the Commons/Annex.

NJROTC Students: Will not be attending NJROTC due to the shorter class periods. Students will have practice after school at EHS.

In order to connect students with post-secondary schools, scholarships, and recognition programs, the College Board shares student data at their discretion. If you do not want your student's data shared with such programs, your student may opt out of data sharing on test day. It is the student's responsibility to opt out. This is not monitored by test proctors. If a student opts out, their data will not be shared with colleges, scholarship organizations, or recognition programs.

High School & Beyond Family Night October 11

History

High School & Beyond Family Night was developed at JHS at the turn of the century. It has been exciting to see its growth across the district, and we look forward to seeing our families attend on **Wednesday**, **October 11**, 2023. The night kicks off with an outstanding College & Career Fair, where families can gather information about potential post-high school options. After the fair, high school families can attend two breakout sessions that best fit their student's high school and post-high school goals. If a high school family attends every year, the family will have the opportunity to attend eight breakout sessions. Because of this, we recommend you use the "recommended grade level" notation as you pick sessions to attend.

We also have a session dedicated to understanding the FAFSA or WASFA (financial aid). You can even bring your financial aid questions and get individual help! New this year, we'll also have a special session dedicated to navigating the college application process. We look forward to helping families understand this important, exciting, and emotion-filled time as our seniors plan for their post-high school adventures!



9th and 10th grade families: Jackson is a big school! We're here to help families understand the options and requirements of high school. We hope you take time to attend our "High School 101" session! This session is dedicated to supporting 9th and 10th grade families in receiving valuable and practical information as your student begins their high school journey and prepares for post-high school options.

Having a little fun: On the days leading up to High School & Beyond Family Night, students and staff are asked to wear college- and career-based clothes! If you love a particular college or career, this is a great time to sport their name on your t-shirt!

Students: Talk with your teachers about where they attended (look for the special High School & Beyond signs at the entrance of each teacher's classroom to learn more)! If you see that a staff member attended a college or had a career you are interested in learning more about, ask them questions about their experience!



High School & Beyond Events

Everett Public Schools is holding High School & Beyond events this month.

Students and families will be able to connect with colleges, universities, trade schools, and apprenticeships from Washington and other states. Washington-specific schools will be highlighted, including our local community colleges. The number of college and career representatives available to support our efforts continues to grow, and we are looking forward to providing access to these rich, personalized resources to our students and families.



To increase access to each unique school community, the three comprehensive high schools have collaborated to provide a customized format on three specific dates in October as follows:

- Cascade HS | October 4, 2023 | 6-7:30 p.m. | Gym
 - o The College and Career Fair will take place during the Curriculum Night event
- Jackson HS | October 11, 2023 | 5:30-7:35 p.m. | Gym & Main Building
 - o The College and Career Fair will take place in conjunction with High School & Beyond Family Night
- Everett HS | October 24, 2023 | 9 a.m.-12:30 p.m. (families are invited to attend 11 a.m.-12:30 p.m.) | Gym
 - o The College and Career Fair will take place during the school day

Details will be available on each of the high schools' homepages. If a family is not able to attend their school's event on the designated date, they are welcome to attend the HS & Beyond event at one of the other two high schools.

Interpreters from prominent languages of each school will be on site.

GoFan Ticketing for School Sports and Activities!



GoFan, a digital ticketing and promotional service designed for school sports and activities, is available to all community members for in-person or advanced purchase at Memorial Stadium and paid events at each high school. The service provides more access and visibility to the district's ticketed events by offering payment by credit card through their platform, allowing users to view and subscribe to upcoming events and empowering the district with various tools. In-person cash payments are still available, and students with ASB cards receive free admission to sporting events.


The opportunity to pay by credit card at the ticketing window will reduce the amount of cash handling and prevent patrons from needing to leave for an ATM when they do not arrive with cash. There will be no direct cost to the district as GoFan charges \$1.00 + 3% as a convenience fee to the purchaser, and all equipment required has been provided complimentary to each high school and Memorial Stadium. The equipment also utilizes cellular connectivity, so it will require no additional infrastructure for implementation. By partnering with GoFan, the district will be able to increase accessibility to school events, increase participation, and increase community involvement.



Safety Reminders

As mornings become darker and darker, drivers, please keep an eye out for students walking and waiting at their bus stops. Families, please have your students wait for the bus to come to a complete stop and the flashing lights and stop sign to be fully out before they cross the street. Here is a great graphic showing when to stop for school buses, and if you are ever in doubt—STOP! Other safety reminders include:

- Students and parents should wait on the curb when waiting for the school bus, not off the curb or in the street.
- Do not stand in school crosswalks; obey crossing guards if present.
- Be focused and aware when walking in school parking lots. We encourage walkers to stay
 off their cell phones while walking. Dark mornings may make it difficult for drivers to see
 walkers.
- Bicyclists must abide by the same laws as drivers, which means they must stop for school buses when applicable.
- If possible, wear lighter colored clothing/coats or add something reflective on darker clothing.



School Meals for 2023-24



This school year, our school will have a paid meal program; however, any student in grades K-12 who qualifies for reduced lunch will receive their meal for free. Essentially, there is no longer a "reduced" lunch category as all free and reduced meals are simply free. Families can apply for free and reduced meals by **filling out the online form**.

We are so excited to be able to use this program to offer free meals to the students in our district who may need some extra support, and to all of our students, no matter where they learn, we will continue to offer nutritious and delicious meals that include seasonal fresh fruits and vegetables, scratch-made whole grain foods, and lean proteins, with vegetarian and glutenfree options, too. There has never been a better time to eat school meals. We look forward to serving you soon!

Attendance Procedures

We look forward to seeing your child at school every day. Regular school attendance is important, and we will work with you to ensure your child is present to benefit from an excellent education. If your child is absent, please email the school at their attendance email address, which you can find on the school website. For JHS, email JHSattendance@everettsd.org.



If email is not possible, and even if you leave a message with the school attendance line, please send a written note to the school office within 30 days after your student returns to school.



Access Your Family's Immunization Information

To access your family's immunization information from the Washington State registry, sign up for MyIR to view, download, and print your student's immunization records securely online. Once you register, you can access the records anytime you need them. You can print your child's Certificate of Immunization Status for school, childcare, and camp programs.







Recordatorios de seguridad

A medida que las mañanas se vuelven cada vez más oscuras, conductores, estén atentos a los estudiantes que caminan y esperan en sus paradas de autobús. Familias, hagan que sus estudiantes esperen hasta que el autobús se detenga por completo y las luces intermitentes y la señal de alto estén completamente apagadas antes de cruzar la calle. Aquí hay un excelente gráfico que muestra cuándo detenerse para los autobuses escolares y, si alguna vez tiene dudas, iDETÉNGASE! Otros recordatorios de seguridad incluyen:

- Los estudiantes y padres deben esperar en la acera cuando esperan el autobús escolar, no en la acera ni en la calle.
- No se pare en los cruces peatonales de la escuela, obedezca a los guardias de cruce si están presentes.
- Esté concentrado y consciente al caminar en los estacionamientos de la escuela. Sugerimos
 a los peatones a que se mantengan alejados de sus teléfonos celulares mientras caminan.
 Las mañanas oscuras pueden dificultar que los conductores vean a los peatones.
- Los ciclistas deben cumplir con las mismas leyes que los conductores, lo que significa que deben detenerse ante los autobuses escolares cuando corresponda.
- Si es posible, use ropa/abrigos más claros o agregue algo reflectante a la ropa más oscura.

El servicio proporciona más acceso y visibilidad a los eventos con entrada del distrito al ofrecer pago con tarjeta de crédito a través de su plataforma, lo que permite a los usuarios ver y suscribirse a los próximos eventos y dar al distrito varias herramientas. Los pagos en efectivo en persona todavía están disponibles y los estudiantes con tarjetas ASB reciben entrada gratuita a eventos deportivos.
