As we continue through this school year, the counselors would like to offer you a place to go to find tools and strategies to manage stress, process emotions, and take a moment to experience some calm. The Virtual Calming Room includes several resources for students of all ages and the adults in their lives.

#### 5 Ways to Wrap Up 1st Semester STRONG

The end of 1st semester is **Thursday**, **February 1**.

- 1. **Get organized.** If you have not already, develop a schedule with all your remaining due dates. Then break down the projects into smaller parts and decide when to do what. Having a plan enables you to take better control of your time and energy so you can handle stress more effectively.
- Control your environment. Notice and take charge of who and what is surrounding you. Spend your time with the people in the places that support you rather than drain you.
- 3. **Be positive about yourself.** Notice your self-talk and make sure you are treating yourself with respect and love, the same way you treat others you love. Self-criticism and shame do not typically promote better behavior, but rather, tend to discourage you. So treat yourself with dignity and respect even when your performance is not perfect. Most of us, most of the time, are doing the best we can.
- 4. **Reward yourself.** Plan some leisure activities in your life. Include people you enjoy being with. It really helps to have something to look forward to.
- 5. **Exercise your body.** Your health and productivity depend upon your body's ability to bring oxygen and food to its cells. So, unless directed otherwise by your healthcare provider, exercise your heart and lungs three to five days per week for 15-30 minutes through activities such as walking, jogging, cycling, swimming, aerobics, etc.

#### 5 Ways to Start 2nd Semester STRONG

The first day of 2nd semester is **Monday**, **February 5**.

- 1. Make a weekly schedule including classes, homework, study, workout, work, etc.
- 2. Spend time studying in the first couple of weeks so the first exam doesn't just hit you.
- 3. Practice good self-care: sleep well, eat well, and get exercise.
- 4. Review your notes every day.
- 5. Keep your room (workspace) clean and organized.



#### **Mid-Year College Reports**

After 1st semester grades are posted (in mid-February), counselors will complete the mid-year report. This will pull students' updated transcripts which will include 1st semester grades (don't worry—the timing of this will work with the colleges to which seniors are applying!). Later this spring, when students know where they plan to attend, students will note that detail in Naviance. That notation will alert our registrar where to send students' final JHS transcript after they graduate in June.

#### **Looking Ahead**

In March, students will choose their course requests online for the 2024-25 school year. They will be asked to enter their primary requests as well as multiple alternates. Registration kick-off will be end of February, and 5th Period Registration Advisory sessions with counselors will be scheduled from end of February through the month of March. This timeframe will be the only opportunity for students to make their selections for 2024-25; due to the tight timeline of developing our master schedule, which is based on student requests, we cannot guarantee that late requests will be accepted. More information will be communicated in multiple ways closer to that time. Thank you for helping your students to make their course selections thoughtfully, and thank you especially for sharing your student(s) with us!

#### From the Career Center

#### Field Trip for IEP/504 and Students with Disability

On Thursday, February 15, there will be a field trip sponsored by the Dept. of Vocational Rehabilitation (DVR) and the Northwest Educational Service District 189 for our **IEP**, **504**, **and students with a disability**. Students will tour three locations on this trip:

- 1) <u>Lake Washington Institute of Technology</u> programs (Baking/Culinary Arts, Welding, Design & Digital Gaming, Architectural Technology, Machining Technology & Mechanical Design, Nursing, and Auto Body/Auto Body Repair)
- Western WA Sheet Metal JATC business location (to explore possible apprenticeship careers with on-the-job training and classroom study)
- 3) <u>Cascade Boys & Girls Club</u> to learn about 40-, 80-, or 120-hour paid internships for students 16 years and older. Last summer over 30 businesses partnered with Everett Public Schools to provide paid internships.

The field trip form, information, and parent letter are available in the Career Center. Students and parents need to complete and submit to the Career Center (1) a field trip form AND (2) a Pre-Employment Transition Services (Pre-ETS) form. **Parents:** We ask that you review and submit the linked DVR Pre-ETS consent form if your child would like to attend this field trip and wishes to participate in future tours and/or paid internships in 2024. #### Historical Black Colleges & Universities (HBCU) Tour

#### April 8-14, 2024 | Sponsored by NW Black Pioneers

Students register SOON and pay to visit a mix of up to 22 public/private/single-gender/co-ed HBCU schools, rural and urban. JHS students need to provide their own transportation. Students will miss school and will be responsible for missed course work.

## **College Application Workshops**

For seniors (and any juniors graduating in June) interested in applying to UW Bothell or Central Washington University: Sign up in Naviance under College Visits for their upcoming application workshops in our Career Center, January 8 for UW Bothell and February 16 for Central. Their reps will help you with your personal essays and submitting your application, plus give an application waiver.



## **Scholarship Opportunity**

The City of Mill Creek is accepting nominations for the Association of Washington Cities (AWC) Center for Quality Communities (CQC) scholarships. Visit millcreekwa.gov/awc for information and applications.

#### **How to Apply**

The City of Mill Creek will nominate one first-time student applicant and one continuing CQC scholarship recipient. The nominee recruitment and selection process happens through your city. City nominations are due to the Center for Quality Communities by February 8, 2024, which means we need student applications by **January 12, 2024**.

#### **Eligibility**

Students interested in consideration for the Center for Quality Communities scholarship must be:

- Active in community leadership and civic service through city government, community groups, or school, either now or in the past;
- Eligible to earn a high school diploma, homeschool diploma, or GED in spring/summer 2024;
- Planning to continue education in the 2024-25 academic year at an accredited college or trade school at least half-time; and
- A Washington state resident.

Previous CQC scholarship recipients are eligible to apply for a continuing student scholarship if they are in good academic standing and planning to continue their education in the 2024-25 academic year at an accredited college or trade school at least half-time.

## College in the High School

Starting with the 2023-24 school year, there is **no cost** to students in grades 9 through 12 at public high schools to enroll in College in the High School (CiHS). CiHS programs provide college-level courses in high schools to qualified students. The students can earn both high school and postsecondary credit by completing postsecondary-level courses with a passing grade. To earn college credit, students are required to register on or before the registration deadlines set by the college. Registration for college credit occurs at the beginning of the college course or content. JHS offers a variety of CiHS courses through Everett Community College and a few through the University of Washington. For more information on registering:

Good Citizenship Day is observed on January 16. On that day, social studies teachers coordinate a voter registration event in each history or social studies class attended by high school seniors. Students who will be eighteen years of age or older by the time of the next general election will be allowed to register to vote online in the classroom. Paper registration will also be made available in the classroom.

## **Delayed Start or Closed Schools**

If we must <u>cancel school or delay the start of school</u>, we will use our parent communication system to call in the morning, typically around 5 a.m. (or sometimes the night before if it can already be determined) with a brief message about the reason for closure or delay. We will also use local media, social media, and post the message on our website.



If there is no announcement about Everett Public Schools, school is on the
